Labor of Love for 47th Council District Candidate Todd Dobrin
Receives strong support from unions and working class families in last campaign filing

Brooklyn, NY- Todd Dobrin, candidate for the New York City Council, District 47, raised \$13,000 during the last filing period, bringing his total campaign contributions to \$37,000. But most importantly, Dobrin's latest campaign filing shows the unmatched support he received from labor unions and working class families throughout the 47th District.

Dobrin collected contributions from 357 individuals without taking any money from LLCs or developers, unlike other candidates in the race, who have greatly benefited from receiving a large portion of their campaign contributions from those sources. The majority of his fundraising, came in the form of small donations \$50 or less, evidencing the grass roots campaign Dobrin is running to elect a working class man to lead the working class people of the 47th District.

Dobrin also enjoys strong support among labor and community organizations, having received an unparalleled number of endorsements from unions and tenant associations. Contributing to his campaign during the latest filing period was: The New York City Central Labor Council; Local Union # 3 International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers; International Brotherhood of Teamsters Joint Council No. 16 PAC; and the Soft Drink Brewery Workers PAC.

"I am especially proud of the high number of individual contributions and endorsements from within the local community," said Todd Dobrin. "These are people who are responding to my appeal for community based activism, with as many people as possible taking part in decisions that affect our entire District. I will continue to work hard for working class families so they know that with me as their City Council Member, they not only have a friend, but a voice," said Dobrin.
